Several ribs were broken. collar bone fractured and his lung was pierced by a splinter of broken bone. He was standing on the platform which runs around the mouth of the tunnel, superintending the raising of earth. The bucket which carries the earth to the top came up and he grab-hed it, in order to swing it for dump-ing. Slightly over balancing himself, he leaned against the bucket and it swung away from him. Not having a firm hold on it, he tried to throw himself back to a standing position on the boards, but his feet slipped on the

snow-covered footing and he fell. He landed on his shoulders.

Dr. Bruce L. Riordan was called and he ordered the man taken to the hospital, where he was conveyed in H. Ellis' private ambulance. Wagner is 39 years of age and has been boarding at 51 Simcoe-street. He

is a junior partner in the firm of which his father is head. They have the contract for the trunk sewer excavating work. A telegram was sent to his father. The doctors have small hopes of his recovery.


