AUSTRIANS ARE BEATEN WITH LOSSES OF 100,000

More Than 23,000 Prisoners Are Taken, While Casualties Are Enormous—Italian Soil at Last is Freed From Ancient Enemy and Successful Troops Are Continuing to Advance.

ROME, Aug. 25.—The Italian troops on the Isonzo front are marching to complete victory.

The final success of the Italians, in winning their greatest battle in this war, is thrilling the country as never before.

FURTHER ADVANCE MADE

A further advance has been made on the Isonzo front, north of Gorizia, closely pursuing the Austrians...

The battle is beginning to reveal itself in its vastness. The action north of Gorizia, from Aug. 19, onward, may be epitomized as follows:

The troops of the second army, after having thrown fourteen bridges across the Isonzo under the fire of the enemy, passed over the river on the night of Aug. 18-19...

Our troops are now continuing their advance toward the eastern border of Bainsizza Plateau...

On the Carso yesterday the battle came to a standstill temporarily. Our small advances rectified the captured positions, which were consolidated, and the

enemy's attempted counter-attack failed under our fire. The prisoners thus far number 600 officers and 23,000 men.

The battle between the Italians and the Austrians still rages, with the Austrians stubbornly retreating at many points...

The official communication on the result of the battle shows that the demoralization of the Austrian troops is in part due to the extraordinary aerial and artillery work of the Italians...

The total losses of the Austrians from all causes are reckoned at nearly 100,000, the most important of which, in the Carso region, have not yet been officially announced.
