- Assistance to deserving young men desirons of being qualified for the Ministry
 of the Church, but requiring aid in pursaing their studies at the Collegiate
 Establishment at Windsor.
- Aid to Sunday and other Schools, to which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Church of England.
- 9.—Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools.
- 10.—Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishments at Windsor.
- 11.—It shall also be one of the objects of the Society to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, and for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen, but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to these objects, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.

To these objects, generally, the contributions will be applied; while those who desire it may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects. And, as some members of the Church, who are not unmindful of the great spiritual wants of their own neighborhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small, from the means with which a gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit in darkness—

11th. This Soci ty will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the heathen,—to which object such sums will be strictly confined by the East India Committee of that Society.

12th. The accounts of the Society shall be closed on the 31st December in each year, and shall be audited in one month from that time, by auditors to be appointed by the Executive Committee.

13th. An annual sermon shall be preached before the Society, — the preacher, time, and place, to be appointed by the President.

14th. At each annual meeting of the Society, the first five on the Executive Committee shall go out of office; but all or any of them shall be eligible for re-election. The new members shall be first proposed and seconded, then elected by ballot, and placed at the bottom of the list.

15th. None of the above Bye-laws shall be altered, except at a general meeting of the incorporated Society; and a full year's notice of a proposal to change any of them must be given previous to the meeting at which the proposed alteration is to be effected.
