mortgages, with a few amounts paid by new subscribers for 1868. The Committee deeply regret that of this sum but a mere trifle was received from the country parishes, where very many subscriptions still remain unpaid, notwithstanding the Circular of 1865, signed in accordance with a resolution of the D. C. S. To endeavour to remedy this tardiness, the Rev. Dr. Hensley has been recently appointed to collect through the country all sums due to this Fund, and this gentleman is now beginning this work. The Committee hope that Dr. Hensley's mission may be successful, and also that the few in Halifax who are indebted to this Fund may not longer delay payment. A full statement of the fund will be laid before the Annual General Meeting of the D. C. S. in July. The amount now at the credit of this fund is between \$73,000 and \$74,000.
