Rates to all countries included in the Postal Union, except United States—Books and Calendars, 1c. per 2 oz. Letters, 5c. per ½ oz. Patterns, 1c. per 2 oz. Cards and Circulars, 1c. per 2 oz. Newspapers, 1c. per 2 oz. Samples, 1c. per 2 oz.

COUNTRIES INCLUDED IN THE POSTAL UNION.—*British Empire, Argentine Republic, Austria, Belgium, Bolivia, Bosnia, Herzegovina, Brazil, Bulgaria, Chili, Colombia, Costa Rica, Denmark and Colonies of, Domingo (Santo), Ecuador, Egypt, France and Colonies, etc. of, Germany and Colonies, etc. of, Greece and Guatemala, Hawaii Islands, Hayti, Honduras, Italy, Japan, Labuan, Lagos, Liberia, Luxemburg, Mexico, Montenegro, Netherlands and Colonies, etc., of, Nicaragua, Norway, Paraguay, Patagonia, Persia, Peru, Portugal and Colonies, etc., of, Roumania, Russia, Salvador, Servia, Siam, Spain and Colonies, etc., of, South African Republic, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, United States, U. S. of Colombia, Uruguay, Venezuela, Zanzibar.*

Parcel Post for the United Kingdom, and Colonies.—Parcels securely packed and closed for U.K., and countries and colonies to which parcels may be sent via England, and for Newfoundland, limited in size to 2 feet length by 1 foot width or depth. Postage must be prepaid, 16c. first lb., 12c. each additional lb.; limit of weight 11 lbs. For Newfoundland, 15c. per lb., or fraction of a pound. The postage for other countries must be ascertained at the Post Office.

Canada Parcel Post.—Must not exceed 5 lbs. weight, nor 2 feet x 1 foot in length or thickness, rate 6c. 1c. 4 oz. Registered, 5c. extra. Limit of weight for Patterns and Samples 8 oz., other articles, 5 lbs.

Registration.—All classes of matter may be registered to places in Canada, the United States and Postal Union Countries, and the sender may entitle himself to an acknowledgement of delivery from the party addressed by the payment of a fee of 5 cents in addition to the usual registration fee of 5 cents.

Money Orders, Canada.—Are issued at the following rates: not exceeding \$4, 2c., \$10, 5c., \$20, 10c., \$40, 20c., \$60, 30c., \$80, 40c., \$100, 50c. Money orders for Postal Union Countries, colonies and abroad are granted at rates not exceeding \$10, 10c., \$20, 20c., \$30, 30c., \$40, 40c., \$50, 50c.

General Hints.—Address the Postmaster-General, Ottawa, or the Inspector of Division (see names and addresses, page 66) when any occasion for complaint arises. Enclose envelopes of letters sent about which you seek information or make complaint.

Transmit money by Money Order only when possible, otherwise register.

All letters or parcels should contain the sender's name and address.

Postmasters are not compelled to give change.

Letters imperfectly or improperly addressed, or upon which the necessary postage has not been paid, go to the Dead Letter office. Add County, Province or Country after the ordinary address.

Letters insufficiently stamped are charged double the deficiency on delivery; and those posted without any stamp in Canada go direct to the Dead Letter office, Ottawa.

Letters bearing on the envelope a request that they be returned to the sender if not delivered within a specified number of days will be so returned without charge in Canada.

Letters and other mailable matter addressed to the Governor-General, his Secretary, to Ministers, Deputy Ministers, the head of branches in their official capacity, title, etc., go free.

British and Foreign newspapers and periodicals may be re-posted to subscribers in Canada at the 1 cent per lb. rate.

To enclose a letter or letters, or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter, in a parcel, book, packet, etc., is punishable by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$40 in each case.
