Misses Harriet Smith, Bessie Wilson and Florence Estabrook at N. H. S.

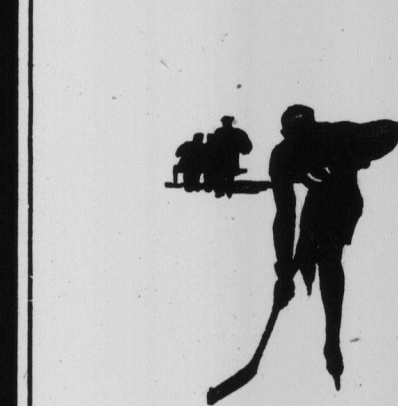
