ANOTHER MEXICAN BANK CLOSES DOORS

Mexico City, Jan. 6.—Financial dif-
ficulties which have developed here dur-
ing the present week today caused the
closing of another bank when the Mer-
cantile Banking Corporation, a United
States institution, failed to open at its
usual time yesterday.
The manager said a run in which
heavy depositors participated in the state-
ed last week and had resulted in too
much of a strain on the bank's re-
sources.

OFF ON 1,000 MILE JOURNEY TO THE ARCTIC AND BACK

Dawson, Y. T., Jan. 6.—Five crack
Canadian mounted police dog teams,
drawing toboggans will leave Dawson on
Thursday morning on a thousand mile
trip to the Arctic coast. They will
travel 800 miles directly north through
the wilderness and snow, and over the
rocky mountain divide to Fort MacPherson
and then return.
They are expected back about the first
week in March and likely will bring
first advices of the winter from Fort
Norman old fields and from Arctic ex-
plorers and whalers frozen in along the
northern edge of the continent.

SEES LITTLE FEAR OF RUSSIAN COMPETITION WITH OUR WHEAT YET

Ottawa, Jan. 6.—(Canadian Press)—
That the grain growers of the dominion
have little to fear from Russian com-
petition in the immediate future, is indi-
cated in a report from the office of the
Canadian Trade Commissioner at Milan.
There is also said to be little pros-
pect of grain from Roumania or Jugos-
lavia finding its way to the European
markets in considerable quantities.

U. Konick, of Endicott, N. Y., has not-
ified the Reading International League
Club management that he will not play
with the Reading team this season, as
he will manage the Adirondacks Stars,
an independent team at Harrisville, N. Y.

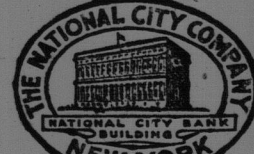
