MARITIME NAVAL WORKS. To the Editor The Times:—Sir,—In view of the position taken by the employees of the Maritime Nail Co., Limited, as appears in one of the daily papers, in justice to the management of this company, I would ask you to publish the following letter—an original of which was sent by Mr. Elkin just before he left for the west, to every one of our employees as at 31st of December, 1920:—

"Dear Sir,—As I am leaving tonight for the west, to be gone some ten days, we are desirous that you should have a clear understanding of the position. Our mill was shut down for reasons given on the bulletin board. At the present time we have no new business to commence operation with, and since we closed down, the price of nails has been reduced 86c a keg in St. John and 50c a keg in Montreal, due to competition. There is considerable talk of unemployment and hardship occasioned thereby. If any of our employees are out of work for any great length of time, it is because they desire that state of affairs and not because we will not meet them in a fair manner. As soon as business conditions warrant, and the mill conditions are adjusted, we will be again prepared to start up the works. When we decide to start, the men who have made application from among our old employees will be given first consideration and will be consulted, but when we decide to start, we will have made arrangements for sufficient men to operate the mill and no further applications will be considered.

A reasonable time, therefore, will be given to our old employees to seek work if they desire it. If the mill starts and they find themselves without employment, we will be their own fault. All you have to do is follow the notice on the bulletin board and apply to Mr. Marvin if you desire work. If sufficient men are shortly available for work, an effort will be made to start earlier than otherwise, due to our desire to assist as much as possible unemployed local conditions.
