

MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRE

Thanksgiving Day in the United States has been fixed for Nov. 27. The Prince of Wales rode in the cab and drove a locomotive into Trenton, Ont., yesterday from Flavelle, a distance of about twenty-five miles. He promised a photograph of himself to each of the crew as a souvenir. Damage amounting to \$30,000 was caused by a fire at Halifax yesterday in a building occupied by J. M. Fraser, the Canada Cafe and other tenants. A solid Protestant party has been elected in Newfoundland according to late reports last night. The old government was defeated. In the Winnipeg civic elections an issue will be the matter of reinstatement for all civic employes dismissed during the recent strike. The labor platform is for their reinstatement.

V. C. Court Martialled

London, Nov. 4.—Lieut.-Colonel J. Sherwood Kelly, holder of the Victoria Cross, was today sentenced by a court-martial to be severely reprimanded. The offence to which Lieut.-Colonel Kelly pleaded guilty was writing to a London newspaper in which he charged that there had been "a scandalous waste in Iraq, and of vast sums of money" in British military operations in Russia.



LAST EVENING IN THE EVANGELISTIC CAMPAIGN



London, Nov. 5.—(By the Associated Press)—King George gave his view of the former German emperor in the course of an audience with a missionary from Armenia, Archibald Forster. When the missionary told the story of his captivity of four years, saying that the troubles had all been instigated by the Germans, the king replied: "Well, they are finished now. The Kaiser has had to run away from his own country. He is well punished for all he did."

TWO COMETS SEEN AT KIOTO AND PARIS


