

The schooner Cape Blomidon sailed from New York on Oct. 31 for St. John with a cargo of hard coal. Nagle & Wigmore are the local agents.



LAST EVENING IN THE EVANGELISTIC CAMPAIGN






CONSERVATIVE LEADER.


