Proposed By-Law

Of the Municipal Council of the Township of East Nisour.

A By-Law to raise by way of loan the sum of Ten Thousand Pounds, payable within twenty years, for the purpose of Graveling, Macadamizing or otherwise improving certain Roads in the Township of East Nisour.

WHEREAS it is expedient to raise by way of loan the sum of Ten Thousand Pounds, for the purpose of Graveling, Macadamizing, or otherwise improving the Tenth Concession Line from the Village of Ingersoll, to the middle of the fourth range of Lots, and thence through the fourth, third, second and first lots of the Tenth Concession, southwesterly to the Village of Ingersoll, and also for the purpose of improving the side lines leading therefrom;

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to issue Debentures payable as hereinafter mentioned, for said purposes, and it will require the sum of Eleven Hundred Pounds to be raised annually as a special rate for the payment of said Debentures and the interest thereon, as the same shall become payable according to the By-Law;

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the Township of East Nisour, according to the last year's Assessment Returns of the same was Sixty-Nine Thousand Five Hundred and Fifty-Four Pounds, Eight Shillings, and it will require the annual rate of Four Pence in the Pound on said rateable property as a special rate for the payment of the said interest, and for the creation of a sinking fund for the payment of the principal of the said Loan, according to the requirements of the Upper Canada Municipal Corporation's Law Amendment Act of 1851.

Be it therefore Enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of East Nisour:

First: That it shall and may the Council do, that the sum of Ten Thousand Pounds be raised by way of loan, and the same be repaid by the issue of Debentures, the sum of Ten Thousand Pounds, and the interest thereon, as the same shall become payable according to the By-Law;

Second: That it shall and may the Council do, that the sum of Eleven Hundred Pounds be raised annually as a special rate for the payment of said Debentures and the interest thereon, as the same shall become payable according to the By-Law;

Third: That it shall and may the Council do, that the sum of Four Pence in the Pound on said rateable property as a special rate for the payment of the said interest, and for the creation of a sinking fund for the payment of the principal of the said Loan, according to the requirements of the Upper Canada Municipal Corporation's Law Amendment Act of 1851.
