Cockle Shoal Light, NC-In 7 feet of water on the lower end of Cockle Shoal, and the easterly side of Teaches Hole channel, from Ocracoke Inlet into Pamlico Sound, NC, and 3-8 mile from Ocracoke lighthouse. This light, desig-nated in the list of lights and fog signals as Ocracoke Wreck Point light, will hereafter be known as Cockle Shoal light. The color of the structure has been changed from red to red and


