

## PARTNER IN A NEW YORK FIRM PLACED IN JAIL

Harry Horowitz Pleads Not  
Guilty of Starting Blaze  
in His Factory.

### EVIDENCE OF MOST CAREFUL PLANTING

Firemen Found Fuses Set to  
Gasoline Soaked Piles of  
Waste.

New York, June 15.—Investigation of a fire that destroyed the fur manufacturing establishment of Stanley & Son & Horowitz, 112 West Twenty-fourth street, Fire Marshal Thos. P. Brophy said yesterday, revealed the most thorough "planting" of any incendiary fire of recent years.

Firemen rescued the burning building at 11:15 o'clock Saturday night, Marshal Brophy said, and discovered three separate fires and three other places where waste and oil had been scattered.

Fuses Set To Gasoline.

In the big left room occupied by the firm fuses had been set to piles of gasoline soaked waste and the plan was full of gasoline vapor, according to the Fire Marshal, which made the work of the firemen extremely dangerous. Those lines were run into the building and by quick work the firemen managed to put out the three fires alleged to have been set and then discovered the other "plants."

The damage was not heavy. Firm Deeply in Debt.

Horowitz, who appeared at the court in answer to a summons from the fire officials, was subjected to close questioning by Marshal Brophy, and it was said admitted that the firm was \$50,000 in debt and carried heavy insurance. A statement was submitted by Albert Joseph, a broker, according to the Marshal, in which it was stated that Horowitz had taken out \$25,000 additional fire insurance through Joseph last month. The complaint against Horowitz was sworn to by Detectives P. J. Sheehan and G. Heidt, who aided Marshal Brophy in making the investigation.

## Wild Scene In The Streets of Belfast

Republicans Charged With  
Organizing Riot in Clifton  
Street Area.

Belfast, June 14.—Rioting, accompanied by heavy revolver and rifle fire, was rained in the Clifton street area of this city early today. In authoritative circles it was asserted that the rioting was organized by Republicans for the purpose of preventing the visit of King George to Belfast on June 22, for the purpose of attending the state opening of the Ulster parliament.

Business men going to the centre of the city from the suburbs today at eight o'clock found themselves in the midst of a riot in Clifton street, the centre of the disorder was adjacent to the Ulster military headquarters, which is flanked by North Queen street and the Carrick Hill Republican areas. Denizens of these districts awaited for shipyard workers, and opened fire.

Top hatted merchants dodged about amid flying bullets and one newspaper man had a very narrow escape as a lamp post behind which he had sought shelter was struck by bullets. Stenographers fled, screaming, from the battle zone, and tram cars, with their passengers lying flat on the floors, dashed past at record speed.

Police were hurried from the Glenravel street barracks nearby, but the rioting continued for some time, although at a more subdued pace. North
