The Bank Holidays in Upper Canada are the Queen's Birthday, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Ash Wednesday, and Easter Monday. Also all days appointed by proclamation for Solemn Fasts, or for Thanksgiving. All bills, notes, &c., falling due on these days, as well as on Sundays, must be paid the days previous.

Terms of the Court of Queen's Bench, and Common Pleas.

Hilary commences on the first Monday in February, and ends on the Saturday of the following week.

Easter Term on the first Monday in June, and ends on Saturday of the following week.

Trinity, on the last Monday in August, and ends on the Saturday of the following week.

Michaelmas, on the third Monday in November, and ends on the Saturday of the following week.

The long Vacation commences 1st July, and ends the 21st August.

COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS, C. W.

This Court is held quarterly in each County Town, and by adjournment from time to time, for a period of not exceeding 30 days. The Judge of the County Court is *ex officio* Chairman of the Quarter Sessions, who, together with one or more magistrates of the County or the United Counties, constitute the Court. The Court has jurisdiction over all cases of Larceny, Misdemeanor, and other minor offences. Trials are by Jury.

Sittings—First Tuesday in January, April, and July, and third Tuesday in November.
