There is, however, a noticeable lessening of the tension. and this is due to the fact that the blockers fear the effort of stopping all upplies for the public service. More less official statements are forthoming that the Opposition will not take the responsibility of refusng the usual percentage vote of the estinates for the new fiscal year.

It is also stated that the Liberals ave abandoned the intention of maintaining the blockade of the Navy Bill on the lines previously followed, namely, of continuous weekly sittings. If these ammouncements are made good the effect upon the course of the Parliamentary struggle will be
