



the top is applied to the lining. The waist is closed along the left shoulder and under-arm seams, the front lapping over fitted under-fronts that are closed at the center. Under-arm gores separate the front from the wide, bias back, which is stretched smoothly over the lining. The lower edge of the waist is followed by a narrow, bias belt that is outlined with iridescent gimp. Similar gimp trims the neck edge of the front and also the edge of the picturesque Marlborough collar, which is

in four sections and ends at the open neck. The collar rolls becomingly and may be in either of the two depths illustrated; on the inside it is of the green silk overlaid with the lace net. The sleeves may be long coat-shaped affairs with short pulls arranged on them and made either plain or pointed at the wrists. OL they be short puffs finished with

deep lace frills.
