time shall be expired, the person so discharged without notice shall be entitled to wages for the full time included between the day when such notice should have been given, 5 and the day of his or her discharge as aforesaid.

V. And be it enacted, That any and every Penalty on Servants de-Domestic Servant, Journeyman or Labourer, serting their engaged by the month or longer space of work. 10 time, or by the piece or job, who shall desert or abandon the service or job for which he, she or they shall have been engaged, before the time agreed upon, shall for each and every offence he liable to a fine or penalty 15 not exceeding fine pounds currency, and to an imprisonment not exceeding thirty days.

VI. And be it enacted, That any and all Penalty on persons designedly harbouring or conceal-bouring ranaing any Apprentice or Servant engaged by way servants. 20 written act or agreement, who shall have abandoned the service of his or her Master or Mistress, or instigating or engaging any Apprentice or Servant to abandon such service, shall be liable to a fine or penalty not 25 exceeding five pounds currency, and to an imprisonment not exceeding thirty days for each and every offence.

VII. And be it enacted, That all complaints How comfounded upon contravention of any of the plaints under the four pre-30 four next preceding sections of this Act, may ceding sections be heard and determined before any one and determined Justice of the Peace, who may summon the ed. offender before him, and on proof of the service of such summons may, either in the 35 absence or presence of the offender, determine such complaint in a summary manner, on the oath of any one or more credible witness or witnesses to be sworn before him, and may if the offender, be convicted, sentence 40 such offender to the penalty and imprisonment hereby imposed for the offence, and may commit, such offender to Gaol accordingly, and levy such penalty by warrant of
