endangered, meet and consult upon the measures which it may be proper and expedient to adopt, and may require the attendance of any Notary complained of or misconducting himself as aforesaid, and of any person or persons as Witnesses, either for or against such Notary, and them may, if need be, examine upon oath (which oath the senior Notary is hereby authorised to administer) and may after examination, deliberate and make such complaint or presentment in writing against such Notary, to the Court of King's Bench, for the District as justice and the circumstances of the case may require; which Court may consider of such complaint and presentment, and may thereupon suspend for a time or perpetually such Notary from the exercise of his profession, as may be adjudged or decreed by such Board, or may wholly reject the same, or may order such other legal proceedings as to Law and justice it may seem expedient.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this Act shall have continuance, and be in force until the first day of May, which will be in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and thirty, and no longer.
