Dear Mr. Heydt:

As Mr. King has it in mind to have a day in Toronto and a day in Chicago, on the way to Colorado, he is planning to leave Ottawa on the night of Wednesday, May 22nd. That would bring him to Chicago on Friday morning, the 24th instant, and it is his understanding that you will reach Chicago on the following morning.

I am securing transportation for Mr. King and myself to Chicago, but not beyond that point, in accordance with the understanding had with you in New York.

If you have not already written on the points, Mr.

King would be obliged if you would send him definite information
as to the time of your arrival in Chicago, and the time at
which our departure from Chicago for the West is planned; also
the place of meeting in Chicago and the railway route from
Chicago to Colorado.

But for the circumstance of Mr. King leaving Ottawa a couple of days earlier than was anticipated, I should not
