Rev. Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 29th ultimo with applications for admission to the Lytton Industrial School.

In reply I beg to say that these are approved, with the exception of those of Edward Dennis and William Dick. In reference to the first mentioned the Department desires to know the religion as it is not stated in the application. All the information asked for on these forms should at all times be given.

William Dick should not be allowed to remain in the school and the suggestion of the doctor that he be sent to the hospital should be carried out.

With regard to Byron Spinks a close watch should be kept upon him and if he should show any evidence of epileptic fits he should be discharged from the school.
