We want no class government in Canada. We want no government in Canada based on bargaining between groups . We want Canada to be governed by a party which has an honourable name, and an honourable tradition, a party large enough and generous enough to embrace within its ranks, men and women of all classes, of all races, of all creeds, of all sections of the country, but, who at heart, are one in their determination to improve the lot

of their fellowmen.
