

TRIAL BY FIELD GENERAL COURT MARTIAL OF F.11106

WITNESS TAKEN

Prosecutor Capt. H.J. Clennett calls Pte. Mc Donald (W.N.S.R.) as first witness.

FIRST WITNESS: is sworn in.

Question by the defense. Lt. J.R. Cameron. (W.N.S.R.)

A.- Yes sir.

Q.- Was it an English soldier?

A.- No a Canadian.

Q.- Do you know private Thibault?

A.- The first I saw him was in this court.

Q.- At the time of the alleged fray you were with Pte. Morrison?

A.- Yes sir.

Q.- Did Morrison hit Thibault kick Thibault or molested him in any way.

A.- No sir.

Q.- Did he have any argument with Thibault?

A.- No sir.
