of their reserve, to sell the logs and clear the land at the some time, and in order to assist them in this the Gover had appropriated \$3,500 to buy the engine and properly equip them with outfit for the logging. This money was in the nature of an advance, which the Indians subsequently repaid. When the piled slash was burned these Indians would have out of this 40-acre plot about 30 acres that would make pasturage the remaining 10 acres being very rough and stony, of such a character that the Department would not incist upon any attempt at its reclamation as farming land, as it would not be worth the time and labor. The 30 acres referred to was in an ideal situation for fruit farming, being benchland and well adapted to fruit growing. Two garden patches had been made in this tract during the present season. This he regarded as the only serious attempt at agriculture in his Agency. The small patches referred to wave cleared about the time that he became Agent. Land had also been cleared at any number of the old Indian settlements, but when the Indians had undo gardens about these they had failed to care for the gardens after going to all the trouble of putting in vegetables, etc., largely because of their going away for the fish -ing for the cameries. It was practically impossible for these Indians to combine gardening with their standard occupation of fishing for the canneries. In his opinion the fish ing would continue indefinitely as an occupation for the Indiams; he thought the Indians were now earning a little more by their fishing than eight years ago, chiefly because of the better price obtained for the fish. Besides fishing for the conneries the Indians spent from one month to six weeks every Pall, fishing for their own use, getting quite as many fish as before although not using as many, because of their having got into the hebit during recent years of using white men's foodstuffue They could if they so desired got as many fish as ever, although with perhaps greater effort than in the old
