HOMESTEAD **REGULATIONS.**

Any even numbered section of Dominious panels in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, excepting 8 and 38, which has not best homescended, or reserved to provide wood bus for sections, or for other purposes, may be sole head of a family, or any male over 13 years of ago, to the extent of one-quarter sec-tion of 103 acres, more or inserving the section of the sec

ENTRY

Entry may be made personally at the loca land office for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or if the homestealer desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interfor, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Innuirration, Winnings, or the Local Agent for authority for reach the tomake entry for him. A fee of \$10 is charged for a homestead entry

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans:-

(1) At least six months' residence upon and ultivation of the land in each year during the erm of three years.

(2) If the father for mother, if the father is decased) or any person who is eligible to make a homesteal entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of this and entered for by such person as a home-stead, the requirements of this Act as to re-sidence prior to obtaining tatent may eastisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in themanner pre-scribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisi-of Clauses (2) (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 ac of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of sto with buildings for their accommodation, a have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making applica-tion for patter the settler must give air months notice in writing to the Commissioner o Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to
