MUST PAY PROPER POSTAGE. Ottawa, March 13.—The post office department issued a notice today stating that parcels addressed to members of the Canadian Contingent now serving with the British Expeditionary Forces on the Continent must be prepaid at the rate of postage applicable to parcels for France, while parcels addressed to members of the Canadian Contingent in England are liable to postage at the rate applicable to parcels for the United Kingdom.
