

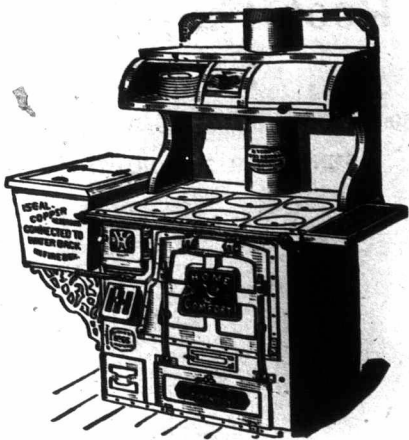

The Widdifield Self-Opening Gate exhibited at the "Industrial" affords a great convenience to people driving horses. By simply pulling down a weight attached to a rope the gate opens away from the horse and closes after being passed by a slight pull on the weight. The necessary attachment can be fitted to any gate very conveniently. It is extremely simple in construction, therefore not liable to get out of order. The gate can be raised to any desired height in the winter season.
 The Toronto Picket and Wire Fence Co. displays at the Industrial their two sorts of fence, viz: The Combination Picket and Wire Fence, with pointed pickets held firmly, two, three and four and a-half inches apart, with three, four and five steel cables; and their Lock Grip Section Fence, having double twisted galvanized Bessemer steel wire No. 12, held rigidly by means of twisted wire stays two and two and a-half feet apart. Four miles of this fence is in use on the Ontario Experimental Farm, Guelph.
