to carry the faid Will into full execution, humbly pray, that a law may be made, establishing the said House of Industry, as directed by the Will of the said John Conrad Marsteller, under such regulations and conditions, and in such manner, as to the Provincial Parliament, in their great wisdom, shall seem meet.

On motion of The Solicitor General, seconded by Mr. Papineau, sen.

RESOLVED, that the said Petition be referred to a Committee of five Members, to report thereon, to this House, by Bill or otherwise, and that they have power to send for persons and papers.

ORDERED, that Mr. Solicitor General, Mr. Papineau, senior, Mr. Bourdages, Mr. Viger, and Mr. Papineau, junior, do compose the said Committee.

A Bill for applying a further fum of money towards the building and completing of a Common Gaol for the District of Montreal, was, according to order, read a second time.

On motion of Mr. Papineau, senior, seconded by Mr. Durocher;

RESOLVED, that the faid Bill be referred to a Committee of five Members, to report thereon, with all convenient speed, and that they have power to lend for persons and papers.

ORDERED that Mr. Papineau, senior, Mr Louis Roi, Mr. Durocher, Mr. Solicitor General, and Mr. Saint Dizzer, do compose the said Committee.

An engrossed Bill, further to continue the Acls therein mentioned, for making temporary provision for the regulation of Trade between this Province and the United States of America, by land or inland navigation, was read for the third time.
