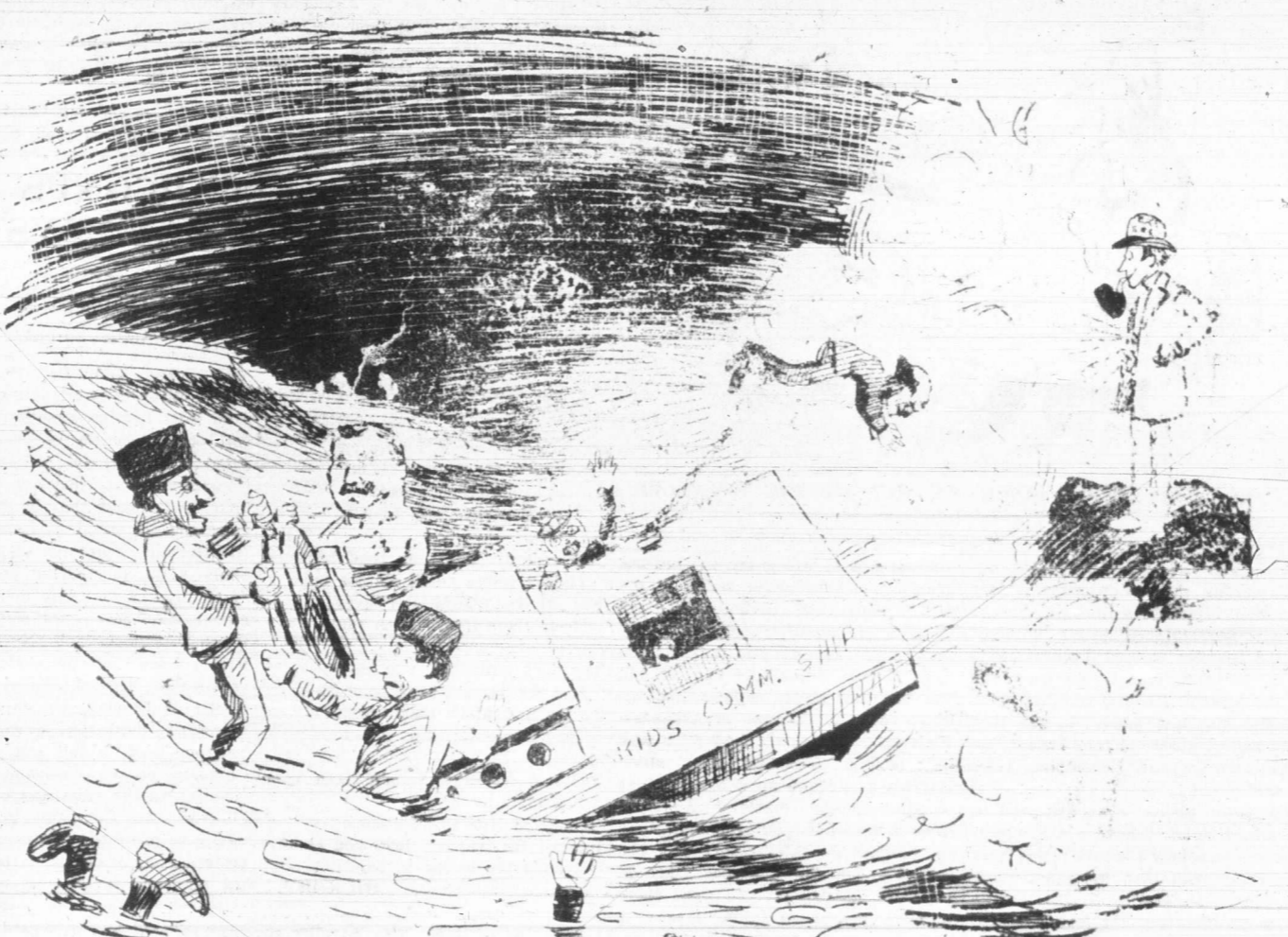

Telegram Received by Thos. W. O'Brien Today States That Agreement for Construction of Bonanza Railway Has Been Reached - Hawkins En Route to Dawson.

Definite news reached Dawson today in the form of a private wire to Thos. W. O'Brien that all arrangements for the construction of the railroad from Klondike City to the Forks have been completed.

Mr. O'Brien was seen by a Nugget representative and stated that the above telegram cleared away all difficulties in connection with the road and that construction work will begin just as soon as Mr. Hawkins can reach Dawson.

"Everything is ready for the commencement of work," said Mr. O'Brien, "and just as soon as Mr. Hawkins, who is now en route to Dawson, reaches here, the building of the road will be undertaken. By the terms of the contract which has been entered into with Mr. Hawkins, that gentleman secures the controlling interest in the road and will be the active manager of the same."
