The official estimate places the number of Boer shells fired during the bombardment of Kimberley at about 1,000, and ours at no fewer than 600. As the enemy's shells so frequently hit soft sandy ground, the explosive effect is greatly neutralized.

All our wounded are in very satisfactory condition. An armored train proceeded toward Dronfield to reconnoitre, but this immediately aroused

noitre, but this immediately aroused the enemy's cordite gun, and the train returned after the fifth shell had been fired. The Boers are firing on the reservoir from Wimbledon.
