## 19 BULLS IN SUCCESSION.

Sergt. Kerr, 48th Highlanders, Makes a Record at Bisley.

Bisley Camp, July 12.—(C. A. P.)—In the Gregory match yesterday Sergt. W. Kelly of the 10th Royal Grenadiers made a possible of 35. In shooting off the tie, his score was 5, 5, 4.

Staff-Sergt. H. Kerr of the 48th Highlanders, in the Gregory, made a possible. In shooting off the tie shots in this match he made 12 bulls, a total of 19 in the match.

Pte. C. L. Morrice, 1st Prince of Wales Fusiliers, Montreal, made 34 in the Gregory.

In the Association Cup match, service rifle, at 200 yards, Sergt. Kelly made 32, and Capt. W. H. Forest, 8th Regiment, Victoria, 32. In the same match, at 600 yards, Kelly scored 33 and Forest 32.

Sergt. W. Fugh of the Royal Canadian Artillery, Quebec, made 25 at 200 yards and 31 at 600 yards.

In the Kynoch match, G. W. Russell of Ottawa scored 46 out of a possible 50. A. Boulton, 6th Regiment, Victoria, made 41.

In the Alexander Martin, 10 shots at 500 yards, Pte. A. Wilson, 43rd Regiment, Ottawa, made 48 out of a possible 50. Capt. J. M. Jones of the 82nd Regiment, Townhill, P. E. I., also made 48.

In the Armorer's Co., a 16-shot match at 500 yards, Pte. A. Wilson of the 43rd Regiment, Ottawa, made 46.

In the sweepstakes at 300 yards Staff-Sergt. C. R. Crowe, 30th Regiment, Guelph, took second place, winning 22 shillings. Capt. J. Duff Stuart of Vancouver was eighth, winning 22 shillings.

In the sweepstakes at 600 yards, Sergt. G. W. Russell, G. C. F. G. Ottawa, was first, winning 8 shillings.
