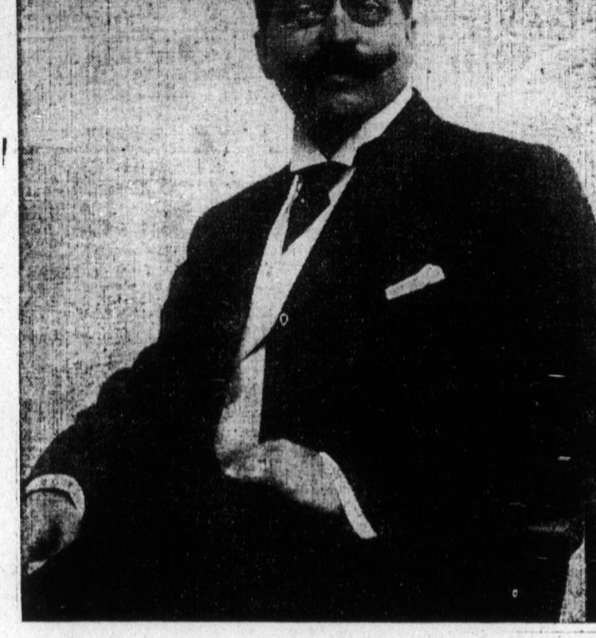

ate compliance was compulsory. Recent investigations by the provincial officers, however, shows that in many cases this has not been done.

As a result Mr. J. E. Rogers, superintendent of provincial police, yesterday instructed all officers of the force to institute immediate prosecution in all cases of theatres and shows in which the letter of the law had not been lived up to. In cases of conviction the crown has decided to press for the full penalty.

Owing to recent instances of danger to life resulting from carelessness or disobedience of the law, the Government has determined to insist that the act be absolutely complied with in all its requirements.
