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consecration of Mr. Smith took place on October 28, 1885, on the Festival of St. Simon and St. Jude, Apostles, amid all the pomp and ceremonial incident to the Roman Pontifical and so important an event, the like of which had certainly not been held in Scotland for more than three centuries, and which had never happened in the Scottish capital before. Dr. Strain was the first prelate who enjoyed the privilege of being Archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, and the consecration of an Archbishop of Edinburgh had certainly not taken place before in this country. We hear the Collegiate Church of St. Giles being frequently called a cathedral, as if a Bishop or Archbishop had had his chair there; but St. Giles Parish Church never had been an cathedral in the good old times; and if an act of Parliament nominated a Bishop, and appointed this church as his Cathedral, neither the old Church of Scotland permitted it, nor did the new Church in Scotland tolerate it.

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
