LARGE DECREASE. A statement of the codfish shipments from the Labrador coast the past season, shows a large decrease in comparison to that of 1912. In 1912, 194,995 quintals were shipped, valued at \$682,482.50, whereas the shipments of 1913 amount to only 112,689 qtls., valued at \$529,638.50, showing a decrease from the previous season of 82,306 quintals, and in value \$152,844.
