## THE LAST OF THE EVIDENCE

(Continued from page 6.)

A. Well, the only files in connection with railroad matters that I know of are the files that I had in my possession, which I presume are all there.

Q. Well, as far as the departmental files are concerned, with regard to the matters, which of those would not be under your control?

A. I cannot tell you what other files there might be.

Q. Did you know until you saw that file that there were any railway files in the department of public works that you were not familiar with?

A. That might possibly be.

Q. You did not know until you saw this file here today?

A. Would you put that question again?

Q. Until you came here this afternoon and looked at this file No. 30, you understood that you had charge or under your control all the files of the department with regard to railway matters?

A. No.

Q. Now which of them would you not have charge of?

A. Files dealing with matters of policy, etc. The only railway files I had in connection with matters involving dealings with the railway companies direct, as to railway crossings and such as that.

Q. I see, and general files with regard to railway policies you had nothing to do with?

A. No.

Q. Well now, there were specifications prepared, were there not?

A. For whom?

Q. By you or the department in connection with the Alberta & Great Waterways railway?

A. I prepared specifications, yes.

Q. Did you find any of those on those files?

A. I haven't seen them on here, they might be. I haven't got to the end of it yet.

Q. Just glance through the rest. It is a bulky document, is it not?

A. Yes.

Q. Now you are at file 30,999, are you not, with which you are familiar?

A. No. This is Great Waterways yet I don't see any file numbers on many of these documents. That is the end of 30.

Q. Now glancing through the others, there are no specifications so far?

A. Not that I have seen, no.

Q. When were these prepared?

A. I don't remember the exact date. It was some time the latter end of October, the fore part of November of last year.

Q. And do you know what happened to those?

A. No, not directly. One copy I handed to Mr. Stocks or to Mr. Cushing, I don't know.

Q. At the time you asked for it, did you have any information as to what had happened to the office copy, the one you handed to Mr. Cushing or Mr. Stocks?

A. No, further than I understood it was not in Mr. Cushing's possession at that time.

Q. Well, had you any information as to why it was not in Mr. Cushing's possession?

A. I had not.

Q. And did not give any explanation to Mr. Goddard of why it was not in the office?

A. Mr. Goddard never asked.

Q. I mean altogether apart from any inquiry. You did not give any away?

A. No.

Q. And now you find you prepared some reports in connection with the Alberta & Great Waterways project, did you not?

A. Well, more in the nature of memoranda.

Q. Did you find all those on those files?

A. As far as my recollection goes.

Q. Do you remember when you prepared the first of those reports or memoranda?

A. I couldn't give the exact date; the first memorandum I prepared was, I think, about a year ago last September or October.

Q. Do you find that on those files?

A. I think it is.

Q. Just turn it up, will you?

A. But I am not positive whether it is or not. As far as I recollect, this is the document.

Q. Is it dated?

A. No, there is no date on it; it was simply a disconnected memorandum.

Mr. Justice Harvey: It is numbered?

A. Yes, C-24 is on here.

Mr. Justice Beck: Is file C the file you have personal charge of?

A. Those numbers have been put on the file since.

Mr. Justice Harvey: C is all the public works department.

Mr. Blygar: That one is on the one known as the Alberta & Great Waterways, general No. 33,000.

Mr. Justice Beck: \$3,000 is the one you have particular charge of?

Witness: Yes.

Mr. Blygar: That is the only one at that time, was it, Mr. Chambers?

A. As far as I recollect.

Q. And when was the next one? Now had there been no report earlier than that?

A. That was the first intimation I had of the proposed existence of that railway.

Q. That was the first intimation that you had?

A. In fact that was before the railway was formed.

Q. When was the next report prepared?

A. I don't remember. I think there was nothing further prepared until possibly the year after that.

Q. And that is the one that is marked C-24?

A. As far as I remember that was the next.

Q. Was there any later than that?

A. I don't think so.

Q. And as far as you remember those then were all the reports?

A. Yes.

Q. And as far as you have now observed, there was nothing that was on the file when it was in your possession that is not now upon it?

A. No, as far as I know.

Q. Except the specifications, or were they ever on it?

A. They were never on.

Q. I am not sure that is nothing that is not now on the file that ever was on it so far as you know, without exception?

A. As far as I know, yes.

Mr. Johnston: We have no other witnesses except Mr. Seymour.

Mr. Robson: The same remark applies to him as to the other man.

Mr. Johnston: I will only ask him about one question, Mr. Robson.

George S. Seymour having been duly sworn was examined by Mr. Johnston and testified as follows:

Q. Are you in charge of the Alberta & Great Waterways office?

A. I am at the present moment.

Q. What is your position generally with the company?

A. I am auditor of the company.

Q. You have certain files in your possession of documents and correspondence concerning a railway company?

A. I have the company's books, vouchers, matters of that sort.

A. Yes, sir.

Mr. Johnston: And all of these books I understand, Mr. Robson, will be produced for inspection?

Mr. Robson: Everything that is in Mr. Seymour's control.

Q. Do you know of anything that ever was in the office bearing on the railway company and its affairs?

A. No, sir.

Q. Or its organization? What company are you in the employ of, the railway company or the construction company?

A. Both.

Q. Well, treat my questions as applying to the two companies. If there is any difference to be made between them you can make it in your answer. Have you any knowledge of any documents or correspondence of any kind that ever was in existence that is not now in existence?

A. No, sir.

Q. Or that ever was in the office, that is not now in the office?

A. It is in the office now.

Q. Everything that you know of as having been in the office is there now?

A. Yes, sir.

Cross Examination by Mr. Parlee

Q. How long have you been in charge?

A. Since February 25th.

Q. And I understand that Mr. Goddard was in charge prior to that time?

A. Well, you see, Mr. Goddard is now in with appointments.

Q. But he was in charge of that?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. And I understand, did you keep the minutes of the directors?

A. No, I had nothing to do with that.

Q. You would have charge of the vouchers, you said, I think?

A. Yes.

Q. And all payments out?

A. Yes.

Q. In whose name is the bank account kept of the Alberta & Great Waterways?

A. Dr. Waddell's.

Q. And in what bank?

A. The Royal Bank.

Q. So all money belonging to the Alberta & Great Waterways are kept in the name of Dr. Waddell in the Royal Bank here?

A. Yes, sir.

Re-examination

Mr. Johnston: For how long has the account been kept in that manner to your knowledge?

A. Since the beginning.

Q. Since when?

A. Well, my knowledge goes back to Feb. 25th.

Q. Of this year?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. And that is all that you can speak to now?

A. I believe it was kept that way since the beginning.

Q. Do you know of any other accounts in any of the other banks in which any of the moneys of the Alberta & Great Waterways company have been kept or are kept?

A. Do you refer to the proceeds of the bonds?

Q. That money there or any accounts of any kind whatever?

Q. Well, my question is whether you know of any other account in any bank whatever in which any of the Great Waterways company's money has been kept or through which dealings have been had by that company and also the construction company?

A. I have no personal knowledge.

Witness: I have no personal knowledge.

Mr. Johnston: Of any other account whatever than that account kept in the name of Dr. Waddell?

Q. You are the auditor, you said?
