Township Insurance.

Mr. R. P. Campbell addressed a meeting of No. 1 Farmers' Institute, of Plympton, the other day on the subject of township insurance on farm property. He objected to the incorporation of companies with unlimited powers of speculation to keep up an army of high salaried officials, and paying sometimes a dividend of 27 or 35 per cent. No insurance company should be speculative in nature, but should be on the equitable basis of mutual reciprocity; and the present system was morally wrong and degrading in tendencies; it further discriminated against the farmers in the interest of the companies, for the reason that the loss by fire on farm property was much less than in towns or cities, the large amount of money coming from the farmers going to pay the losses. coming from the farmers going to pay the losses there. The speaker recommended the enactment of a simple measure by the Local Government empowering the township councils to insure all farm buildings and stock the valuation to be made by the township assessor, subject to appeal at the Court of Revision, and the collector to collect the same. The measure should further provide that there be no other officials of offices created for the purpose in the township; that no rate be levied after the first until required; that all property insured shall at the expiration of the companies' policies come under the Township Insurance Act at the same value until the Court of Revision meet, which court shall have the same power as in the township assessment; that no loss to the owners shall be sustained by the companies' policies running out; that on their expiration the township shall assume the responsibility at the value after the township assessment and Court of Revision meet. Mr. D. S. Robertson, county sceretary of the Patrons of Industry, ably supported the suggestions of Mr. Campbell, pointing out the advantage of the proposed mutual insurance method, over the present system. By unanimous vote it was decided to send the report of the meeting to the Advernise R.
