

#### TO KEEP UP FREIGHT RATES.

Sixteen Railway Presidents Meet in Council.


An Important Agreement Proposed-Sir Charles Rivers-Wilson's Views.

New York, Aug. 16.—The committee of sixteen of the railroad presidents in the trunk line and central traffic associations interested in keeping up the freight rates met this morning in the offices of the Trunk Line Association. President Ingall, of the Chesapeake and Ohio and "Big Four" railroad companies, presided in the absence of President Depew, who is in Europe. Sir Charles Rivers-Wilson, of the Grand Trunk of Canada, was present.

The meeting did not adjourn until after 5 o'clock, after which the secretary gave out this statement: The proposed agreement discussed at the former meeting was taken up, and after considerable discussion was unanimously referred to a further meeting of all the presidents of all lines to be convened in New York about the middle of September. The agreement affects all east and

west bound passenger and freight rates, and if adhered to strictly will accomplish an enormous increase in the earnings of the companies interested. Under it contracts with shippers are to be entirely abolished and commissions on tickets are to be stopped. There is to be no money pool, but there are to be penalties for infractions of the agreement. There is to be a clearing to settle balances between roads. A commission is to be created with a power to make wages and a committee on arbitration is to be appointed to dis-

pose of differences which arise.
Sir Charles Rivers-Wilson, the new president of the Grand Trunk, was present and made a ten-minute speech, and although he did not refer to the relations of the Canadian Pacific and the Grand Trunk, which are known to be at odds, the fact that he looks favorably upon the plan discussed is an indication that there will probably be an agreement also between the two last-named lines. Mr. Wilson said among other things that the English holders of American railroad securities were just as anxious about the success of the agreement as American railroad men were, and that the strict adherence to the provisions of the agreement by all railroads would result in increas-ed confidence in American management by the English capitalists.
