SIXTEEN CASES ON LIST

Long Docket for the December Sessions Next Week.

Eleven Civil Actions—Small Amounts Are Involved.

The December sessions of the peace for Middlesex open at the court house on Tuesday afternoon, and the court promises to be lengthy. Five criminal and eleven civil cases are set for hearing, and some of them will likely take up considerable time.

The grand jury has been summoned as follows: Robert Barr, North Dorchester; J. A. Bailew, London; Peter Duguid, Harrow; David H. Day, Westminster; Edgar Proley, London; R. S. Hobbs, Biddulph; James B. Little, Glencoe; John McRoberts, Carleton Place; John McVicar, Lobo; Neil McLaughlin, West Williams; Elias Roycroft, Moss; George Saunders, McMillan.

The criminal cases are as follows: Jeremiah Henry, stealing; Martin, Glengarry and David Williams, assault; Geo. McGregor, stealing gas from the City Gas Company; and Patrick Cummings, assault.

Of the civil cases only two are to be heard without a jury. The jury suits are: Hayman vs. Buckingham—To recover balance due on contract, Croyon, for plaintiff; E. Meredith, for defendant.

Burton vs. London Street Railway Company—To recover part payment for coal given to the plaintiffs at the time of the strike in a horse-drawn car, ordered, Croyon, for plaintiff; Ivey & Dromgole, for defendants.

Fallows vs. Morris—To recover \$47.50 on a cattle deal. H. B. Elliot, for plaintiff; Meredith, Judd & Elliot, for defendants.

Mills vs. Baldwin—To obtain goods stored on the premises of the defendants, who refuses to give them unless he is paid in advance, up unless he is paid in advance, for the rental of the property. Elliot for plaintiff, Croyon for defendants.

Martin vs. Trebilcock—To recover part payment for defendant, E. Meredith for plaintiff, T. G. Meredith for defendants.

The two non-jury cases are as follows: May vs. Doherty—For damage done to goods while they were being conveyed to the hotel. Gibbons for plaintiff, W. A. P. Campbell for defendant.

Freedom Oil Works vs. Western Oil Company—Action to recover damages for oil shipped to the defendants. Gibbons for plaintiff and Elliot for defendants.

Whereas, by departmental order, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of October, 1903, the movement of live hogs into or out of the district composed of the Townships of Tilbury East, Raleigh, Dover, East and West, Chatham, and Harwich, in the County of Kent, and the Island of Lambton, was strictly prohibited; and whereas, it has been deemed expedient to extend the said district so as to include the Township of Tilbury West and Tilbury North, in the County of Essex.
