DEATH OF DR. ANDERSON

Young Physician Well Known in London Passes Away.

News has been received here of the death at Webbwood, Ont., of Dr. Andrew Anderson, who was well known in London.

The doctor, who was 29 years of age, was born on a farm near Lindsay, and went to St. Thomas from Tillsonburg, being employed in the drygoods store of Northway & Anderson, now the Anderson Company, Limited, St. Thomas, for several years. While there he took an active interest in military matters, and during the years 1888 and 1899 was captain of A Company, Twenty-fifth Regiment.

Leaving that city early in the nineties, he went to Toronto, and commenced the study of medicine in Trinity College. At the breaking out of the South African war he was one of the young Canadians who first responded to the call to arms.

He went with the first Canadian contingent, being a member of B Company, London, R.C.R. Among his comrades were W. J. Green, Capt. H. H. Westaway, John Sutherland, George Stanbury, and "Edgie" Farley, the latter of whom died of enteric fever, and whose remains rest in a far-away South African grave. Dr. Anderson was taken ill with enteric fever at the same time as was the late Edger-ton Farley, and in recovering he joined his regiment. He took part in the battles of Paardeberg, Bloemfontein, Reit River, and all the way through the Transvaal until the end of the war.

On the return and disbandment of the contingent, Dr. Anderson resumed

ed his medical studies at Trinity College, and upon graduation commenced to practice in Webbwood.

SERMON ON MATRIMONY

Bishop McEvay Alludes to Mixed Marriages in St. Peter's Cathedral.

St. Peter's Cathedral was crowded Sunday night when Bishop McEvay gave the second of his series of sermons on "Matrimony."

After a brief review of his first sermon, he entered upon an explanation of the care and solicitude of the church in guarding the sacred contract. For the sanctity of the home and the welfare of society he said the church has enacted certain laws which must be obeyed, and the violation of these constitute what are known as impediments.

There are two kinds of impediments one which renders a marriage null and void, and the second which renders it illicit.

The question of marriage by error, which was common many years ago, but which very rarely occurs now, was dwelt upon.

No person could be compelled to marry a slave, as in so doing he would become the property of the slaveowner. The church had done everything possible to abolish slavery, and recognized fully the rights of slaves to marry.

Marriage with too near relatives was undesirable, although dispensations might be granted in certain cases.

In case a man's first wife died the church did not think it advisable for him to marry again into the same family. A marriage with an unbaptized person would not be recognized and a marriage of a Catholic with a person of any other denomination, unless performed in the presence of a priest, will not be considered valid after Easter, when the new rules go into force.

Mixed Marriages.
Mixed marriages were spoken of particularly, and many reasons were given which showed that they generally terminate in an unhappy manner. A man has a perfect right to marry a second time, and is urged not to wait too long, for the sake of his children.

He should not be dissuaded from taking this step by neighbors saying that he did not respect his first wife. "This is a business in which other people have no right to interfere."

In concluding, the bishop touched lightly on the divorce question.

Must Remain Married.
In his sermon last Sunday Bishop McEvay, in touching upon mixed marriages, said:

"What, therefore, God hath joined together let no man put asunder." What do these words mean unless they mean that God has made it impossible for man to break the mar-

riage bond. Had God a right to do so? Has he the power to do so? God is our Creator and we are his creatures. We have no rights except what God has been pleased to grant us. He leaves us free to get married or to remain single, but he tells us if you get married then you must remain married until the death of your partner. There may be reasons why you may be justified in living apart, but there is no reason that you should marry again, and if you attempt to marry you are not married to the second partner but to the first. You are guilty of adultery. And adulterers cannot enter the kingdom of God. St. Paul says: "But to them that are married, not I, but the Lord commanded, that the wife depart not from her husband, and if she depart that she remain unmarried, or be reconciled to her husband. And let not the husband put away his wife." This is the doctrine of Christ. This is the teaching of the Catholic Church from the time of the Master's words until the present day.
