"A Straight Steal."

"Adding \$25,000 to the Beck debenture is simply a straight steal," said one member, warmly. "Realizing that they can get no money on their own scheme, the commission are simply trying to steal a ride on the spring water wagon. This \$25,000 could have been spent as suggested by Mr. Beck, to better advantage in meters or in supplementary pumping machinery. That would have given sufficient pressure on the present system during pressure requirements of the fire underwriters. The principal trouble is not so much more water, as to increase the pressure.

A Suggestion.

Another member suggested that with automatic check valves placed in Beck-Lyons scheme could raise the city pressure to any amount required, providing the necessary pumping units were installed. This could be done at a very small cost, compared with what the commissioners ask the ratepayers to spend.
