It should be fine grained, the lean with streaks of clean white-looking fat running through it and of a bright red color. Unless there is enough fat the meat will be tough. Cow beef is paler than ox beef, so you can tell it in that way; and it is not so nutritious; but if the meat is of a very dark red it is too old. For soup meat get the shin-bone and a few pounds of the round. Soup meat should have as little fat as possible. The best beef for beef tea is from the round.
