I hereby give notice that the City of Toronto has applied to the Ontario Legislature for an Act entitled "An Act to empower and authorize the City of Toronto to institute an issue of Corporation Stock for Drainage Works."  
The Bill proposes amongst other things:  
1. To provide for the issue of \$1,000,000 (if so resolved) in the name of the Corporation of the City of Toronto for the purpose of making and improving the drainage works only; the rate of interest not to exceed two per cent, and to be fixed by the by-law authorizing the issue.  
2. To limit the taxing power of the City of Toronto to one and a half cents in the dollar on the assessed rateable property of the city of Toronto, in lieu of the rate of two cents, as at present authorized.  
3. To limit the borrowing powers of the City of Toronto to one and a half cents in the dollar on the assessed rateable property of the city of Toronto, in lieu of the rate of two cents, as at present authorized.  
4. That the Act not to come into effect unless and until sanctioned by the vote of the electors taken as by a by-law creating a debt.
