In the slander sction of Coomb v. Hood, a motion was made before the master in chambers yesterday for security for costs under the slander amendment act of 1889. The plaintiff, Margaret Jane Coomb, is a widow who resides at the village of Port Perry, and the defendant, John Hood, a wealthy retired farmer of the township of Pickering. The husband of the plaintiff died some four years ago and she was left with a family of four children to support. She hired at a tel in Port Perry as a cook, and while there the defendant became enamored of her and proposed marriage, which she accepted. A misunderstanding subsequently arose and the marriage did not take place, and as a consequence the plaintiff in this action brought an action against the defendant for breach of promise of marriage and recovered a verdict for \$400 damages and costs.

This verdict aroused the defendant's wrath, and since that time he has been accusing the plaintiff of being a woman of low character and a prostitute, alleging that she had committed acts of lewdness with himself. He also accused her of stealing his spoons and knives. The plaintiff in the present action sues him for \$2000 damages for slander. The master reserved judgment.
