THE WORK AT WOODBINE.

Many Horses On the Track and Several New Arrivals.

A dull, raw morning and heavy track was hardly an inducement to train at Woodbine Park to ask much of the charges yesterday, still some useful work was accomplished.

Dictator and Myra L. were the first to put in an appearance, but only did slow work. The Hendrie horses were also subjected to moderate exercise with the exception of Coquette, Bowring and The Piper.

The Higgins string were all given along with the supervision of Trainer Steeds of Coxey's Army. Bel Demonia negotiated a mile and a quarter in 2:17, the three-year-old Major-General and Eliza Garter got the same distance in half a second longer.

Bestler in company with Lou D. covered a mile in 1:52, Thorndyke and Princeton got the same in 1:52. Johnny Walker paid a visit to Woodbine with Joe Miller, Morphous and Sargeant. The Queen's Plate worked a mile and a quarter in 2:25, while the older horse covered a mile in 1:48.

Dr. Campbell's string were all given strong work. Lonely breezed a quarter in 20 seconds, Johnnie and Melrose covered a half in 56. Johnny Hecker did 2-minute work and Waterloo was sent several miles at half speed. George C. came from the mile pole in 1:48, while the older horse and Evangeline worked five furlongs in 1:07.

Two tips were sent five-eighths in 1:06, and also "sooled" over the hurdles, performing cleverly. The best work of the day was done by Tom Flynn, who, with Blaylock in the saddle, reeled off a mile and an eighth in 2:03 1/2, the first mile in 1:43. In the afternoon the track had dried out nicely when Lou Day was sent a mile and a quarter in 2:11 1/2, being accompanied by Ross Day and Misterfats.

La Bianca covered a mile and a half in 2:04. "Dip" Douglas has sold the 4-year-old black colt Mallard, by Muscovy, out of George, to Mr. J. Hall, the owner of Beefeater, for \$10,000.

GAUDAUR BREAKS A RECORD.

Wins the 3-Mile Single Scull Hand Pushed by Peterson and Duran—Time 19:01 1/2.

ARSTY, Texas, May 17.—The first race of the International Regatta to-day was the final three-mile heat professional scull for a purse amounting to \$2100, the first money being \$1000.

The race of this afternoon was terrific, Gaudaur and Peterson both hustling for first place, though Eddie Duran pressed them hard for honors on the first dash out of the box. Gaudaur turned the even mile and started back down the course with a mad. He led slightly on the down course, though Peterson pushed him hard.

Gaudaur only over the hump, into safety only four feet in the lead of the sculler from the Pacific Slope, making the race in 19:01 1/2, thereby breaking his record of 18:54 of last year, which broke the world record.

Peterson made the run in 19:02 1/2, which broke the run of Gaudaur last year. Gaudaur acknowledges that he was never pushed as hard in a race in his life as he was to-day.

The senior four-oared race for 1/2 mile with turn was won by the Modoc Rowing Club of St. Louis in 10:24 over the Western Rowing Club of St. Louis and the Indiana Boat Club of New Orleans. The professional half-mile dash with a turn was won by Ed Rogers in 4:03 3/4. Modoc Rowing Club won the senior double distance, 1 1/2 miles, in 10:19 3/4.

The great race of the week promises to be the challenge four-oared race for \$1000, which is booked for Saturday from a crew picked by Gaudaur and another by Peterson. Gaudaur boasted that he could pick a crew and beat any team in the world and Peterson promptly took his word.

CITY CYCLISTS MEET. They Don't Like Wheeling Over Broken Ground. The city cyclists have decided to make an effort to keep the roads in proper condition at least in Toronto. At the meeting last night in the T.A.C.M. Mr. A. F. Webster was in the chair while Secretary G. A. Kingston of the Inter-Club Association was invited to write the City Engineer with a view of compelling the Gas Company's employees from sprinkling broken glass and the Street Railway Company from tearing the curbs.

TOOK OFF HIS HAT TO THE JURORS.

Robert Whitaker Showed That He Appreciated His Acquittal—Other Cases in the Session.

The grand jury at the Sessions yesterday brought in a true bill against James Beatty for theft.

Robert Whitaker and Arthur Bernard, two West York farmers, "mixed it up" and Bernard claims that Whitaker stabbed him in the face. Whitaker is charged with felonious wounding and the jury found him not guilty. The coroner's jury returned a verdict of suicide.
