#### MEDICAL SOCIETY FOR MUTUAL IMPROVEMENT.

ST. CATHARINES, Jany. 2nd, 1872.

Dr. F. S. Mack gave an interesting account of a case of placenta provia; he was called in on the morning of the 23ed December, ult, to meet Dr. Considine, of Port Dahlousie, in a difficult obstetrie case. Mrs. II——, the mother of two children, had been suffering from intermittent forcer, and had experienced several slight hemorrhages, which yielded to rest, and the recumbent posture. If xmorrhage commenced on the morning of the above date profusely, and accompanied with irregular durine contractions, attended by increased discharge of blood. Other measures failing, Dr. Considine had recourse to the tampon; which, having failed, had been removed just before the arrival of Dr. F. S. Mack.

He found the patient exanguinons in a marked degree, restless and exhausted. Stimulants were freely given, and conlinued throughout, and, after allowing half an hour to elapse, to permit her to rally a little, Dr. F. Macle proceeded to examine per raginam; he found the est dilated to about the size of a rown piece, and high up; could introduce one finger in the cor-
