## COMMONWEALTH AND FOREIGN GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES IN CANADA

H.E. Hockfield Dr. J.H. van Roijen, Ambassador of the  
Netherlands, left Ottawa on leave, August 30, for New  
York to represent the country at the Second General  
Assembly of the United Nations. During his absence  
Jongeneel G. Beijerse, Van Broeklyn, First Secretary, is  
in charge of the Embassy as Chargé d'Affaires ad interim.  
The Department has been officially informed that the  
Consulate General of Venezuela would assume office at  
126 Pine Avenue West, Montreal, as of September 1.

Mr. Pavle Lukin, Captain d'Affaires ad interim, Embassy  
of Yugoslavia, returning to Ottawa September 5, after his  
assumption.

The Portuguese Government announced the appointment of  
Senor Vasco Vieira Gaião as Consul General (as Acting)  
at Montreal, September 8.

Mr. Saguna G. Olszny was granted honorary reclassification  
September 3, as Honorary Consul General of Peru at  
Montreal.

The resignation of Mr. Biskup Arkelje as Consul.  
Appointed to take effect on September 1.

Mr. Madge T. Foster resigned his post as Attaché  
Attache, Embassy of the United States, and  
having been transferred to Wellington, New Zealand, left  
Ottawa September 3.
