By leave of the House, the said Bill was referred to a Special Committee of seven members, consisting of Messrs. Anderson (High Park), Bury, Cahan, Chevrier, Ilsley, Irvine and MacDonald (Cape Breton), with power to send for persons, papers and records and to report from time to time.

The Order being read for the second reading of Bill No. 5, An Act respecting Unfair Competition in Trade and Commerce;

Mr. Cahan moved,—That the said Bill be now read the second time.

After Debate thereon, the question being put on the said motion; it was agreed to.

The said Bill was accordingly read the second time.

By leave of the House, Mr. Cahan moved,—That the said Bill be referred to a Special Committee consisting of Messrs. Anderson (High Park), Bury, Cahan, Chevrier, Ilsley, Irvine and MacDonald (Cape Breton), with power to send for persons, papers and records and to report from time to time.

After Debate thereon, the question being put on the said motion; it was

agreed to.

The Order being read for the second reading of Bill No. 6, An Act to amend the Fish Inspection Act;

Mr. Duranleau moved,—That the said Bill be now read the second time.

After Debate thereon, the question being put on the said motion; it was

The said Bill was accordingly read the second time, and referred to the Select Standing Committee on Marine and Fisheries.

The House went into Committee of the Whole to consider a proposed Resolution respecting an agreement between His Majesty and the Corporation of the City of Ottawa.

(In the Committee)

The following Resolution was adopted:-

Resolved, That it is expedient to authorize the Minister of Public Works, on behalf of His Majesty, to enter into an agreement with the Corporation of the City of Ottawa to extend the period of the existing agreement with the Corporation for one year from 1st July, 1931.

Resolution to be reported.

The said Resolution was reported, read the second time and concurred in.

Mr. Stewart (Leeds) then, by leave of the House, presented a Bill, No. 12, An Act to authorize an agreement between His Majesty the King and the Corporation of the City of Ottawa, which was read the first time, and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The Bill No. 10, An Act to amend and consolidate the Fisheries Act, was read the second time, and referred to the Select Standing Committee on Marine and Fisheries.
