DUNLOP TROPHY

ROAD RACE TODAY

Also Motorcycle and Other Races This Afternoon at Exhibition Park Track.

All indications point to a big crowd for Dunlop Day at the Exhibition track this afternoon. A stellar program of motorcycle and motor racing has been secured. It includes such motorcycle stars as Bill Gowdy, the Chicago flyer, who makes his first appearance in Canada at this meet; "Krazy Horse," Harry of Toledo, the most consistent half-mile track man in America; and Joe Harbison, the most successful Canadian rider. Never before in the history of Toronto race meets has there been lined up as is represented in Dunlop Day, and other other contestants in the big motorcycle races, and the amateur class will include Fred Miles, the Toronto boy, and other good, consistent riders.

In the motorcycle races, the talent is just as classy. Hans Oht, the world's champion, has been secured to race Art Cooper, the Canadian champion in a series of match races, to virtually decide which of the two is the fastest man in the world on a dirt track.

Altogether, there are nine such events as described above, the tenth being the twenty-second annual trophy race, the bicycle classic of America. Some seventy racers will line up for the big start. The prize list represents a big haul in the trophy, the team shield and medals, three hundred dollars in prize money, and other prizes.

The entire expenses of this meet are being borne by the Dunlop Tire and Rubber Goods Company, Limited, thereby allowing all the proceeds to go to the Canadian Red Cross Society. The Canadian Red Cross Society will sell the programs to help the cause, and the people planning to make a thousand of people planning to make a donation to the Red Cross by buying a ticket and program, a record crowd should be in evidence.

It took a lot of persistency to land Bill Gowdy, motorcycle speed fiend of Chicago, for the Dunlop meet at Exhibition track this afternoon. At twelve o'clock Saturday it looked hopeless, but at 1 o'clock a wire came from the factory at Blackhawk, Wis., saying that Gowdy was his first appearance in Toronto.

At 1 o'clock, the Toledo motorcycle flyer, arrived in Toronto Sunday morning for the Dunlop meet today. He was met by a crowd of fans, and he was taken to the hotel where he will stay during the race.
