A Common Council holden in the Chamber of the *Guildball* of the City of *London*, on *Thursday*, the First Day of *March*, 1770.

A MEMORIAL of the Committee of the Livery of *London*, appointed the 28th Day of *September* last, was produced to this Court; a Debate arising thereon, a Motion was made, that the same be now read? and the Question being put, his Lordship declared the same to be carried in the Affirmative; And a Division being demanded and granted, there appeared three Aldermen and One Hundred and Seven Commoners, besides the two Tellers, for the Affirmative; and Fifteen Aldermen, and fifty-nine Commoners, besides the two Tellers, for the Negative; whereupon his Lordship declared the same to be resolved in the Affirmative; and then the Persons subscribing the said Memorial, being severally called in, the same was read in the following Words:

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
