LET the Minister bring the Public Account fairly forward: Let him shew how he is to provide for the present Exigencies of the Public amply enough, so as not to endanger the Safety of the State, with fome Surplus for future Emergencies, without which we ceafe to be a People: Let him make use of his great Majority to fome great and decided, not speculative, public Advantage: Let him do more, and fay less: Let him make those who went before him unpopular, not by Clamour and Affertion, and by calling Names, but by doing better: Let him do this-and He and I are Friends.
