LADIES HURT IN AUTO SMASH

Mrs. Cawthra Mulock and Miss Adela Boulton the Victims.

Turning sharply to avoid a collision with a cart which had cut in front of the machine, J. Reynolds, chauffeur for Cawthra Mulock, ran the big Limousine car, 2586 into a telegraph pole at the southeast corner of Jarvis and Gerrard-streets, when it skidded on the slippery asphalt.

Mrs. Mulock with Miss Adela Boulton, a daughter of Melfort Boulton, 4 Willocks-street, who were in the car, and the chauffeur were all cut about the face with flying glass of the rear window of the auto, and Miss Boulton's right shoulder was dislocated.

All were taken in a passing auto to the Mulock residence at Jarvis and Isabella-streets, where several doctors were called to attend them.

"As far as I have been able to ascertain," said Cawthra Mulock, "what happened was this: My car was coming up Jarvis-street at a slow rate, driven by Reynolds, who is a very good man, and with the two ladies in it. A cart coming down the street deliberately turned in front of it, and in order to avoid a collision, Reynolds turned sharply, and the car skidded into a telegraph pole."
